#### B. Secretary – Paul Rigge.

#### C. Treasurer – Bob Connop

#### D. CA Representative – Peter Wilson

Our Rep is now Director of All England Handicap Tournament, has seats on both Discipline and Tournament committees as well as General Committee.

Peter also reports that it is the CA's intention to Video and stream the next MacRob held in England (2017).

#### E. League Manager - Tony Thomas

Much discussion about the draft league rules including new league, new calculations required for handicap doubles and (of course) new golf laws. All proposals were accepted unanimously by vote after some minor wording changes were made to the handed out/downloaded draft.

#### **F. Coaching Officer – Ron Welch**

The plan was that I should meet Janet in November for her to hand over details of current NW development and for her to travel with me to the March meeting of the CA Development Committee. However, as you will be aware this became impossible when she suffered a stroke. I shall be picking up loose ends from individual clubs in the next couple of months and would be grateful for any relevant information by email. I would be happy to speak to any club representative here today after the meeting.

I did go to the recent CA committee meeting last weekend. It was by their standards relatively short as there were no new applications for grants. The good news is that this means that the majority of this year's development budget is available.

There has been a change in the rules in that no personal guarantees for loans will be required in future, just a club officer signing on behalf of the club.

Two other points of interest from the meeting. There have been problems with National Trust and English Heritage properties where croquet is played. These are partly due to inconsistencies among the various administrators and the Committee is going to try to approach both organizations at high level with a view to a national agreement. All regions were asked to contribute information - I think Levens Hall is our only relevant house. Please let me know about any others.

Finally, a piece of news from Australia. It seems possible that Dawson balls may disappear as the Dawsons wish to retire and the only interest in taking over has come from the UK. They don't seem keen to let the Poms get their hands on their balls.

Two referee courses are being held 15/16<sup>th</sup> March for AC & 23<sup>rd</sup> March for GC.

#### **G. Coaching Officer – Christine Irwin**

As I am still new in this position I don't have much to report on. So this will be brief.

My plan is to continue to run the very successful Flying Circus coaching days. This one day format seems to suit us. So the main thing I want to make people aware of is the need for Clubs to let me know what coaching will help you.

As a reminder – most clubs have competent Club Coaches who are able to teach newcomers the rudiments of both Association Croquet and Golf Croquet. The Flying Circus is concerned more with players past this stage. We will provide a coach, of the appropriate level of expertise and experience, to move your players on by coming to your club and running a full day course. Please refer to the back of the FIXTURES BOOK for the complete details of which level is required by your members – from Improvers (with Handicaps 20-24) –right through to Gold level.

The intention is to visit any club within the NW Federation during the season that requires tuition, or to put on a course at another club also requesting that level of course. In order to plan the programme we need to know the level required, the numbers involved and the dates when your members and lawns are available. We will publish the dates of courses on the NWFC web site and make them open to all members of the Federation to attend. The Federation will fund the course and so there is no cost to the club (other than providing the coaches with lunch).

Courses and venues already identified are:

BOWDON - IMPROVERS' COURSE, Thursday 10th April. This course is largely a revision of the Beginners' Course but covers techniques to a greater level and prepares players for match play. (Coach – Ken Cooper)

BOWDON - SILVER-GILT COURSE, Sunday 8th June. This course is concerned entirely with advanced play and is intended for those players who have reached a good standard in handicap play but have little experience of advanced. (Coach – Colin Irwin)

## 7. Club Reports and Announcements (to be taken in alphabetical order).

i) **Bowdon, John Saxby reports;**

Bowdon have not done anything different this year. We have wintered well, the lawns have been open virtually all the time, competitions on Mon and Wed been well supported. Canasta on Tuesday and Youth club on Fri night still bloom. Annual dinner/dance at the Cinnamon club gets better.

We host the Northern One Ball Final on 26th April and the Presidents Cup on 5th Sept.

ii) **Bury, Paul Kenworthy reports;**

Winter events held at member's houses and our annual dinner were enjoyable as well as successful in raising £100's of pounds for the club.

Coronation Park lawns, which showed a huge improvement in grass quality in 2013, have suffered a little with the wet winter inducing considerable moss which is being dealt with.

Heaton Park continues to be something of a nightmare in terms of lawn maintenance and our relationship with the bowlers. Financially we are being asked to contribute a sum of £1741 pounds and also pay an increase in lawn charges. We have rejected the £1741 as we do not consider it proportional to our usage and we dispute the increased lawn charges as they have never been agreed at a Heaton Park committee meeting and would make running tournaments at a profit difficult.

We hope to hold the events we have committed to at Heaton Park but have concerns over the condition of lawn 3. The maintenance of this lawn is contentious and is also causing some disputes within our club which I find unpalatable as they would not happen if Heaton Park was more amicable.

The big news for 2014 is that Bury Croquet club is now officially a tenant of a second venue just north of Bury called Whitehead Park. Much praise must go to David Barrett for our acquisition of this facility and his work to make it a potential first class venue for the future. As it stands we have a large but internally somewhat shabby clubhouse. We also have 2 crown green lawns which could be played on as the crown is not too large.

The plan is to level the lawns and at the same time create 3 full size lawns. This is the maximum that will fit within the current boundary. We have the money to achieve this.

The plans for the clubhouse range for a palace with a lounge (big enough for indoor croquet), kitchen, changing facilities etc. etc to a minimum upgrade using members time. This is dependent on the grants that are currently being applied for being successful or not. Once we have established our exact plans for Whitehead Park we will be embarking on a recruitment drive as continued maintenance of this venue will deplete our money reserves with our current membership numbers.

We look forward to another fun season of competitive croquet in 2014.

iii) **Chester, John Dawsons Reports;**

The lawns were closed in November for the winter. At the moment the water is still draining & running off them, so we hope to have them back in action by month end.

Once again we are looking forward to another enjoyable year. We have recently bought a new set of hoops which we will be using for our matches. As well as competing in the Golf League we shall also be entering a team in the Level Play Golf League. The financial difficulties being experienced by the Culcheth Sports and Social Club have meant that we are still spending more on our Lawn maintenance costs. This we have been able to do from our reserves.

Last year one of our aims was to increase our membership and we have recruited several new members. We have also raised extra funding from Social events such as the Quizzes which have been very successful. We are fortunate that we have members who are prepared to work hard, selling tickets and organising such events. We hope to attract new members from these events.

Members from Bury and Pendle were welcome guests at our annual dinner in January and some of our members have attended the Bury annual dinner.

During the winter we play on our indoor mat. This has proved very popular and games of doubles, double banking on the mat to the throbbing rhythms of the Zumba class behind the partition, is an unforgettable experience.

Members from other clubs are welcome to join us. Some of our members also meet together during the winter to play cards and indoor games.

We shall be holding our usual club competitions and once again will be urging members to play their games earlier in the season rather than leaving everything until September.

## **8. Golf Handicaps – Don Williamson**

Don tried his best to clarify the new CA handicaps changes that have been made over winter, basically the scale has been opened up at the bottom to now officially allow minus grades but if you have a Hcp of four and above – don’t read anymore cause it’s that bits not changed. From three down, you must have your card inspected so that you can be re-assessed (‘screwed over’) and given your new grade. Then, if you play in a handicap game you must then use this ‘new’ grade to ‘look-up’ what your ‘effective’ hcp/grade is for that game - irrespective of your opponent’s grade. Got it? – table to be found on CA’s web site.
